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THE PHILLIPS ANNOUNCES 2018 ANNUAL GALA



WASHINGTON—Director Dorothy Kosinski, Chairman Dani Levinas, the Board of Trustees, and Gala Hosts Kay and Sonny Kapoor are pleased to announce The Phillips Collection’s Annual Gala will be held on **Friday, May 4, 2018**. Serving as 2018 Diplomatic Chair is His Excellency the Honorable Joe Hockey, Australian Ambassador to the United States, and Ms. Melissa Babbage.

The Annual Gala, *Marks Made: Ancestral Lands under Australian Skies*, celebrates Australian Aboriginal culture. This summer The Phillips Collection will present *Marking the Infinite: Contemporary Women Artists from Aboriginal Australia*, which features the work of nine leading artists.

The evening coincides with the Contemporaries *Bondi Beach* Bash—inspired by Sydney’s world-famous beach, a sensational night of cocktails, music, food, fashion, and dancing, that brings the Australian waterfront city’s surf culture to Dock 5 at Union Market. The Bash is a sell-out event that attracts over 700 of the city’s most well connected and philanthropic young professionals.

SUPPORTING ARTS EDUCATION

The Annual Gala and Contemporaries Bash raise critical resources for the museum’s award-winning educational programs that forward K-12 education reform, art and wellness, and lifelong learning in the Washington, DC, community, across the country, and globally. These

initiatives include the development of *Prism.K12* to encourage art and wellness integrated curricula across the community through Phillips@THEARC, a partnership with arts and education center THEARC located in DC’s Ward 8.

CELEBRATION OF AUSTRALIAN ARTS AND CULTURE

Founder Duncan Phillips was known for being of “an international mind” and although Australian Aboriginal art was not yet on his horizon, the sense of community and universal language rooted in the symbolic nature of the art would have resonated with Phillips’s artistic passions. *Marking the Infinite: Contemporary Women Artists from Aboriginal Australia*, features the work of nine leading artists: Nongirnga Marawili, Wintjiya Napaltjarri, Yukultji Napangati, Angelina Pwerle, Lena Yarinkura, Gulumbu Yununpingu, Nyapanyapa Yunupingu, Carlene West, and Regina Pilawuk Wilson. The Phillips Collection is pleased to invite one of the nine artists, Regina Pilawuk Wilson, to travel to the United States and paint a mural in the museum’s courtyard.

The exhibition is organized by the Nevada Museum of Art and the works are drawn from the collection of Miami-based collectors and philanthropists Debra and Dennis Scholl. The selection has been carefully curated by the Scholls, in conjunction with Australian curator and art historian Henry F. Skerritt, with many key works commissioned specifically for the exhibition.

ABOUT THE PHILLIPS COLLECTION

The Phillips Collection, America’s first museum of Modern art, is one of the world’s most distinguished collections of Impressionist and Modern American and European art. Stressing the continuity between art of the past and present, it offers a strikingly original and experimental approach to Modern art by combining works of different nationalities and periods in displays that change frequently. Artists represented in the collection include Pierre-Auguste Renoir, Vincent van Gogh, Pablo Picasso, Honoré Daumier, Georgia O’Keeffe, Arthur Dove, Mark Rothko, Milton Avery, Jacob Lawrence, and Richard Diebenkorn, among others. The permanent collection has grown to include more than 1,000 photographs, many by American photographers Berenice Abbott, Esther Bubley, and Bruce Davidson, and works by contemporary artists such as Wolfgang Laib, Whitfield Lovell, and Leo Villareal. The Phillips Collection regularly organizes acclaimed special exhibitions, many of which travel internationally. The Phillips also produces award-winning education programs for K–12 teachers and students, as well as for adults. The University of Maryland Center for Art and Knowledge at The Phillips Collection is the

museum’s nexus for academic work, scholarly exchange, and interdisciplinary collaborations. The Phillips Collection is a private, non-government museum, supported primarily by donations.

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
