ABSTRACT

American Watercolors from the Permanent Collection exhibition records hold material created and collected by The Phillips Collection Curatorial Department during the process of organizing the 1986 exhibition. Included are correspondence and publicity.

HISTORICAL NOTE

Several of the works featured in the exhibition were among the first watercolors to enter The Phillips Collection. In 1926 the first Burchfield, *Cabin in Noon Sunlight*, and a group of Marins, including *Mt. Chocorua-White Mountains* were acquired, as well as *A Country Road* by Alfred Maurer.

SCOPE AND CONTENT OF THE COLLECTION

American Watercolors from the Permanent Collection, held at The Phillips Collection in 1986, was an exhibition which showcased watercolors by American artists, including Charles E. Burchfield, Mark Davis, Arthur Dove, John Ferren, John Marin, Alfred Maurer and Abraham Walkowitz.

These curatorial records were collected and created during the research, planning and execution of the American Watercolors from the Permanent Collection exhibition.

The exhibition opened at The Phillips Collection in Washington, D.C. on April 12, 1986 and closed May 25, 1986.

The primary creator of the exhibition planning records was The Phillips Collection Curatorial Department.

The bulk of the collection consists of exhibition related documents. The records include publicity and correspondence.
