Wednesday, February 15, 2023

Arrive at Airport and check into The Conrad

Thursday, February 16, 2023

Frieze LA

Frieze Los Angeles is back and bigger than ever. The fair will take place across multiple sites at the new location of Santa Monica Airport. Featuring over 120 galleries from 22 countries, including 20th-century art for the first time, alongside a newly expanded Focus section – plus ambitious activations, collaborations with nonprofit organizations, and pop-ups from some of Los Angeles' most beloved restaurants.

Cocktails and Studio Visit with Kim Schoenstadt

Kim Schoenstadt's work plays with the intersection of architecture, sculpture, color, line, history, culture, and concepts. She is known for large-scale wall drawings that weave architecture and sculptural shapes together to make a memory map. Her "mash-up drawings" allow her to defy the laws of gravity



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while incorporating architecture into site-specific installations that engage audiences throughout the construction process.

Art + Practice

Founded by contemporary artists, Mark Bradford and his partner, social activist Allan DiCastro, together with philanthropist Eileen Harris Norton, Art + Practice is a new kind of nonprofit that supports the local needs of transition-age foster youth, and children experiencing displacement worldwide through its collaborations with nonprofit social service providers First Place for Youth and PILA global. A+P also provides Angelenos with free access to museum-curated contemporary art, organized by the California African American Museum.

Dinner at San Laurel

Michelin-starred chef José Andrés at Conrad Los Angeles builds a culinary bridge between the Iberian Peninsula and Southern California. Using the freshest sustainable produce from local farmers' markets in Los Angeles, our cuisine marries bold, beautiful Spanish flavors with the bounty of the Golden State. Named for the aromatic bay laurel, itself a transplant from the Mediterranean to coastal California, San Laurel's inspiration stretches from Spain to the glimmering shores of the Pacific.

Friday, February 17, 2023

The Hammer Museum

Affiliated with the University of California, Los Angeles, The Hammer Museum is an art museum and cultural center known for its artist-centric and progressive array of exhibitions and public programs. Enjoy a special brunch and tour with other Frieze VIP guests before the museum is open to the public.

Los Angeles County Museum of Art

Experience a private tour of *Coded: Art Enters the Computer Age, 1952–1982* with curator Leslie Jones. International and interdisciplinary in scope, *Coded* examines the origins of what we now call digital art, featuring artists, writers, musicians, choreographers, and filmmakers working directly with computers as well as those using algorithms and other systems to produce their work. After the tour, spend some time exploring the rest of the museum

The Getty

Getty is a cultural and philanthropic institution dedicated to the presentation, conservation, and interpretation of the world's artistic legacy. Explore the many exciting exhibitions The Getty has to offer as well as a tour of The Getty Conservation Institute. Travelers will cap off the visit with cocktails on the terrace.

Daniel Canogar Studio Visit

In celebration of the museum's 100th anniversary, Daniel Canogar presented *Amalgama Phillips* – a site-specific project using 550 images of artworks from the museum's permanent collection to create a generative digital artwork that liquefies all the works in a seamless blend of melted imagery. Daniel shares that his artwork is meant to invite viewers to seek out multiple perspectives in discovering the

artwork, incorporating their movements in and around the work as a crucial component of their experience. Now visit Daniel's studio where he will share new projects he is working on.

Hauser & Wirth Gallery

Occupying a former flour mill, Hauser & Wirth Los Angeles presents art exhibitions, events, and learning activities which connect with the local community in a vibrant architectural space.

Lunch at Manuela

Located in the Arts District of Los Angeles, Manuela unites chef, farmer and artist to create an authentic and original dining experience. Under the direction of Executive Chef Kris Tominaga, the menu celebrates seasonal ingredients sourced from the best farms and producers in Southern California.

Museum of Contemporary Art, Los Angeles

Home of the only artist-founded museum in Los Angeles – explore their many exhibitions including: *Henry Taylor: B Side*, *Lonesome Crowded West: Works from MOCA's Collection*, and *Garrett Bradley: American Rhapsody*.

The Broad

Founded by philanthropists Eli and Edythe Broad, The Broad makes its collection of contemporary art from the 1950s to the present accessible to the widest possible audience by presenting exhibitions and operating a lending program to art museums and galleries worldwide. Experience an exclusive tour of their private collection as well as their exhibition *William Kentridge: In Praise of Shadows*, his first major exhibition in Los Angeles in two decades. Surveying 35 years of the celebrated South African artist's practice, this landmark exhibition includes all 18 works from the Broad collection with substantial loans from across the United States and South Africa.

Dinner at Otium

Adjacent to one of Los Angeles' most important cultural corridors — Grand Avenue — and next to its newest, most vibrant addition, the contemporary art museum, The Broad, Otium strips away the rigid formalities of dining while focusing on the quality of food, warm service, and relaxed casual ambience, paralleling the true essence of its name. The restaurant draws inspiration from the 100-year-old olive trees planted in The Broad's adjacent Plaza by utilizing rustic cooking with wood fire and sustainable ingredients grown in the garden of the restaurant's mezzanine.

Sunday, February 19, 2023

Luis De Jesus Gallery Visit

A contemporary art gallery committed to regional and global art discourse with a particular focus on intersectional diversity, Luis De Jesus features many artists including Aaron Maier-Carretero whose work The Phillips acquired during *Inside Outside, Upside Down*. Luis will lead the group through a tour of his gallery and the two solo exhibitions that will be up at that time: Mimi Smith and Hugo Crosthwaite. Aaron Maier-Carretero will be on hand to show some of his new paintings and discuss his practice and more.

Orange County Museum of Art

On route to San Diego, travelers will visit OCMA, which has an established reputation as an innovative art museum with a history of actively discovering and engaging with living artists at pivotal points in

their careers. Explore their new permanent home and their suite of opening exhibitions such as: *California Biennial 2022: Pacific Gold*, *Fred Eversley: Reflecting Back (the World)*, and *13 Women*.

San Diego Museum of Contemporary Art

MCASD is known for collecting works by promising emerging artists and under-recognized, mid-career artists, as well as by major figures in international contemporary art. Experience an exclusive curator-led tour of MCASD and their current exhibitions.

The San Diego Museum of Art is a fine arts museum that houses a broad collection with particular strength in Spanish art. The Museum's collections are encyclopedic in nature, with pieces ranging in date from 5000 BC to 2012 AD. The museum's strength is in Spanish works by Murillo, Zurbarán, Cotán, Ribera and El Greco. Explore the museum and their current exhibitions such as; *Art of the 20th Century*, *Lisa Ross: Elegy to a Uyghur Homeland*, and *Modern Women*.
