Certainly the concentration of effort on the prints and the identification with the medium and the satisfaction of producing some of your most distinguished work during that year in Paris, all are apparent.

He and Mrs. Phillips decided that their many plans for loan exhibitions would make it impractical to show your lithographs in a group, at least now.
